OUTCOMES OF COP29 IN BAKU

New Collective Quantified Goal (NCQG)

- Increases international investments in climate efforts in developing countries to USD 1,300 billion by 2035
- Aims to deliver at least USD 300 billion to developing countries by 2035 through public and publicly mobilized climate action.
- Requires improvement of framework conditions for both public and private climate finance, including possible global taxes
- Expansion of donor countries: Invitation to developing countries in the agreement to make bilateral contributions to climate finance


























OUTCOME OF COP29 IN BAKU

Article 6

- o Agreement on the market for climate credits
- o Paris Agreement now fully implemented

Adaptation and loss and damage:

- o Establishing the Baku Adaptation Roadmap not clear what it includes?
- The Fund for responding to Loss and Damage (FRLD) was fully operationalized
- o No major progress on climate mitigation very weak decisions on mitigation work program
- No decision on follow up on the global stocktake including global energy targets from COP28



COP30 IN BRAZIL

- Geopolitical landscape changed and more unpredictable – multilateralism under pressure
- Denmark assumes EU presidency
- Impression of COP-PSDY
 - Under President Lula, Brazil has reassumed an important role in a global climate context
 - COP30 is of high importance to Brazil
 - Views COP30 as a move towards the "postnegotiation" phase – focus on implementation
 - Expected to be bigger than COP29. However, difficult location logistically – consequences for delegations, and observers.










EXPECTATIONS FOR NEGOTIATIONS AT 30

(Some of the) Expected issues at COP30


- o Parties will submit their NDCs ahead of COP30.
 - NDCs will showcase what countries intend to do by 2035 to contribute to reaching the temperature goals of the Paris Agreement







EXPECTATIONS FOR NEGOTIATIONS AT COP30



(Some of the) Expected agendas at COP30

- Adaptation is expected to be a key topic for COP30 with a high priority for developing countries.
 - o The COP presidency has emphasized that adaption should receive the same attention in the discussions as the reduction agenda.
- Acceleration of the implementation of the Paris
 Agreement, e.g. in relation to just transition and global stocktake (GST).
- Follow up on the NCQG decision the Baku to Belem Roadmap
- o Focus on the rights and inclusion of indigenous peoples and local communities.



DANISH AND EU PRIORITIES

Danish priorities

- o Coincides with Danish EU-presidency in the second half of 2025.
- Lead and coordinate the EU's efforts in the negotiations.
- Be a neutral mediator who reconciles and creates green progress for the EU's positions in the UN climate negotiations.

o EU mandate/priorities:

- EU NDC process is ongoing. Awaiting Commission proposal for a 2040-target, of which the 2035-target is derived.
- Mandate will be agreed by ENVI after the summer break.
- Inclusive COP-process.

o From 23rd to 26th - UNGA incl. HL NDC moment

October

o Date TBD- The Pre-COP will be held in Brazil approximately one month before the main conference, with dates and venues TBD.

November

- o 6th and 7th Leaders Summit in Belém, Brasil
- o From 10th to 21st 30th United Nations Climate Change Conference 2025 (UNFCCC COP30) in Belém, Brasil.

Political priorities at COP30

The climate action plans (NDCs) must be updated ahead of COP30. The NDCs represent each country's contribution to fulfilling the Paris Agreement, and the level of ambition in them is therefore very significant for global climate goals.

Follow-up on the COP28
agreement text regarding the
'transition away from' fossil fuels,
including tripling renewable energy
(RE) and doubling energy
efficiency (EE).

<u>C2</u>

Follow-up on the COP29 agreement text and further detailing of the '1.3 trillion USD roadmap' to mobilize more climate financing for developing countries.

C3

Just and fair green transition, especially with regard to indigenous rights, is expected to become an important theme.

More focus on climate adaptation, including how more climate financing can be directed towards adapting to climate changes today and in the future.

C5

The protection of biodiversity, including tropical rainforests and other vital ecosystems, is expected to be significant in the negotiations at COP30.

Climate leadership under changing geopolitics



Public-Private-Partnerships

Danish Industry, the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the Ministry of Climate, Energy and Utilities, State of Green, and Danish companies will continue their strong collaboration at COP30 to showcase green solutions and achieve results across sectors.

The Danish delegation will unite public, private, and civil society actors at the pavilion. Presenting a united front and aligning with the government's stance strengthens Denmark's position as a green frontrunner.



Denmark's International Role

Denmark will assume the presidency of the EU in the second half of 2025 and, together with the commission, will lead negotiations on behalf of the EU. Denmark will thereby play a key role in 2025.

It is crucial for Denmark and the EU to stand firm and maintain momentum in the global green transition, especially at a time when global tectonic plates are shifting, and some countries are withdrawing from the climate agenda.



Representing Danish Companies

Ambitious COP agreements provide Danish companies with the opportunity to play a role in a concrete, global green transition. The signals offer direction and progress for the actors who innovate, develop, and invest in green initiatives.

Danish companies are world champions in developing and offering the green technologies and solutions that contribute to reducing CO2e emissions and strengthening climate adaptation initiatives.




Towards climate neutrality together

The EU must set an ambitious climate target by 2040 and prepare the climate policy architecture beyond 2030. The Nordic business community stands united behind ambitious efforts to ensure climate neutrality nationally.

- Danish Industry has initiated a position paper in collaboration with Nordic colleagues, where we call for the EU to make bold decisions now and implement policies that ensure decarbonisation and competitiveness go hand in hand.
- Among the nine overarching recommendations, you will find 'striving towards a global price on CO₂', 'closing investment gaps', designing ETS for a post-2030 framework, and 'decarbonising industries and sectors that have not been decarbonised yet'.
- We are in the process of reaching out to our European counterparts to get them on board.







